## Plenary Speakers

### **Fr. Radu Bordeianu, Ph.D.**

Fr. Bordeianu is an Associate Professor at Duquesne University and assistant priest at Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Church, both in Pittsburgh, PA. His research focuses on ecumenical ecclesiologies. He is a co-convenor of the Christian-Jewish Dialogue in Pittsburgh and is involved in local ecumenical dialogues.

**Lecture Title:** *Spiritual Fatherhood and Motherhood in the Eucharistic Community*

### **Dr. Sandra Collins**

Dr. Collins holds a PhD from the University of Pittsburgh with a concentration in Jewish Studies and Gender. She is currently Professor of Sacred Scripture at the Byzantine Catholic Seminary. She is also Director of Information Services at the Seminary where she has responsibility for the library as well as Byzantine Online, their distance learning program.

**Lecture Title:** *A Wandering Aramean: the Eastern Christian in Context*

### **Dr. David Layman**

Dr. Layman is the General Editor for the Mercersburg Theology Study Series. He is also a lecturer at York College of Pennsylvania and Harrisburg Area Community College. Dr. Layman's research interests include the life and thought of John Williamson Nevin, Mercersburg Theology, the philosophy of Franz Rosenzweig, and comparative religion and ethics.

### **Fr. Anthony Ugolnik**

Father Ugolnik is the pastor at Holy Ghost Orthodox Church in Coatesville, PA. He has been a professor at Franklin and Marshall College in Lancaster for 30 years. Father Ugolnik earned his doctorate at Brown University, where he developed a specialty in early medieval western literature.
