Dr. Lee Barrett (Keynote)

Dr. Barrett is the Mary B. and Henry P. Stager Professor of Theology at Lancaster Theological Seminary. Lee's interests include the relationship between the doctrinal traditions of the Christian churches and contemporary culture. He is the author of essays concerning the present-day implications of the theology of the Reformed tradition, as well as the thoughts of Søren Kierkegaard.
